

Lew Ferguson

Ferguson, a longtime PGA Head Professional and Golf Operations Manager for Pinehurst Country Club, passed away in October at the age of 63. Born in Taylorsville, N.C., Ferguson was a PGA of America member for more than 40 years after graduating from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Reynolds, a longtime club professional and standout college golfer, passed away in November at the age of 66. Born in Raleigh, N.C., Reynolds earned All-ACC honors on the golf team at N.C. State, then went on to play professional and work as a club professional at facilities in North and South Carolina. ■



Unique Course Coming to Palmetto Bluff

The masterminds behind Tennessee’s Sweetens Cove – one of the top new golf courses of recent years – is set to bring a new course to Bluffton, S.C. South Street Partners has hired King-Collins Golf Course Design to create a reversible 9-hole course at Palmetto Bluff Club, the first new golf project at the facility since the Jack Nicklaus-designed May River Golf Course opened in 2005.

The new course will run along Palmetto Bluff’s inland waterway and include a mix of par-3, par-4 and par-5 holes across 54 acres of land. The reversible design will begin construction in the new year, and is part of a larger plan for future amenities at Palmetto Bluff. ■
